The program also provides the youth the opportunity to gain skills and résources for healthy lifestyle choices, physical and emotional well-being and risk avoidance skills and resources.



The Summer Leadership program serves 30 youth who learn specialized skills to aid in their journeys in being both leaders in and out of the classroom.

The Youth Council works to provide a platform for 15 young adults to voice their opinions, and ideas, and empower them to take action on the issues that affect them in the village.

The council meets regularly to discuss various topics ranging from education, healthcare, employment, and environmental concerns. Through their discussions, they aim to identify areas that require immediate attention and develop strategies to address them.


